Remembering Bruce Seidman as the Senior Librarian of the Chatsworth Branch:

Bruce has shared stories with us about the previous library and the adventures of dealing the earthquake in 1994, where he found the bookshelves toppled like dominos and card catalogue files scattered. He has also mentioned his experience of working with Friends of the Library member Keith Watts who assisted the Chatsworth Library in getting "online" in 1994 with classes to help learn about computers as the LA Public Library replaced their card catalogues with computers.

Bruce also took an active role in the community meetings in 2001 to determine the location and design of our new library that opened in 2004. He also was an active participant at the Chatsworth Community Coordinating Council, keeping the community up-to date with library activities.

May 5, 2010, "MIDDLESEX" by Geoffrey Eugenides.... The mesmerizing saga of a near-mythic Greek American family and the roller-coaster of a single gene through time. The odd but utterly believable story of Cal Stephanides, and how this 41 year old hermaphrodite was raised.

June 2, '10, "BEL CANTO" by Ann Patchett... A lyrical, witty look at relationships that evolve from a terrorist situation. Surprisingly, terrorists and hostages from different countries and continents become compatriots and forge friendships."A novel that really ropes you in."

July 7th, '10, "THE HERETIC'S DAUGHTER" by Kathleen Kent... Sarah Carrier is bright and willful, openly challenging the small and brutal world in which she lives. She tells the story of her mother's accusation and trial as a witch in Salem, Massachusetts. August 4th, '10, "Lottery" by Patricia Wood... Perry, with an IQ of 76 lives with his cantankerous but good-hearted grandmother. After a lifetime of being shunned, teased and ignored, he wins the lottery and has to learn who to trust. "He's irresistible, it's a feel-good read."
