April 4, 2012 Major Pettigrew's Last Stand

by Helen Simonson – Fiction – 2010 – 358 pages. Sixty-eight-year-old retired Major Pettigrew lives in the small English village of Edgecombe St. Mary. He develops a bond with Mrs. Ali, the Pakistani owner of a local shop. They are both widowed and their relationship is based on a shared love of literature. This late-life romance is constantly nudged off course by the Major's adult son and a group of socialite ladies.

May 2, 2012 Chocolate Wars

by Deborah Cadbury – Nonfiction – 2010 – Call # 338.41664153 C 121 – 348 pages.

The book tells the history of chocolate and of the 150year rivalry between the world's greatest chocolate makers. It also explores the Quaker business tradition. The story ends with Cadbury being acquired by Kraft in 2009.

June 6, 2012 *The Help*

by Kathryn Stockett – Fiction – 2009 – 534 pages. The story is set in Jackson, MS in the early 1960's. A young white female aspiring writer interviews three extraordinary black women whose determination to start a movement of their own forever changes a town and the way women view one another.
