May 1, 2013 The Sweetness at the Bottom of the Pie by Alan Bradley - Mystery - 2009 - 373 A murder mystery set in a 1950's pages. English village. The sleuth is 11 year old Flavia de Luce. She is called into action when a man is found dead in the family cucumber patch and her father is accused of the murder.

June 5, 2013 Half Broke Horses: a true-life **novel** by Jeannette Walls – Fiction – 2009 – 272 The story of Lily Casey Smith. As a child she helped her father break horses. She left home at 15 to teach

school in a frontier town. Later as a wife and mother she ran a vast Arizona ranch. Lily remained a woman of great spirit even in the face of hardship.

July 3, 2013 The Lawgiver by Herman Wouk - Fiction -2012 - 234A romantic and suspenseful novel about a group of people trying to make a movie about Moses.

August 7, 2013 Half the Sky: Turning Oppression to Opportunity for Women Worldwide by Nicholas D. Kristof and Sheryl Wu Dunn- Call # 301.412 K92 - 294 An odyssey through Africa and Asia to meet women who have overcome oppression to become extraordinary. The authors show how a little help can transform the lives of women and girls abroad.

September 4, 2013 The Shadow of the Wind by Carlos Ruiz Zafon – Fiction – 2004 486 pages. The book is set in Barcelona, Spain during the Spanish Civil War. It follows a young boy who can no longer remember his mother's face.



As the City Grew: Historical Maps of Los Angeles First Floor Galleries

Tracing the growth of Los Angeles, the nation's second largest city, is the topic of the new exhibit, "As the City Grew: Historical Maps of Los Angeles" on display at the Central Library, First Floor Galleries, 630 W. Fifth St., downtown.

How We Worked, How We Played: Herman Schultheis and Los Angeles in the 1930s" History & Genealogy Department, LL4

Depression Era photo exhibit, "How We Worked, How We Played: Herman Schultheis and Los Angeles in the 1930s," in the History & Genealogy Department at Central Library, 630 W. Fifth St., downtown. The exhibit offers a glimpse of this ever-evolving city through the lens of Herman J. Schultheis in the midst of the Great Depression and on the eve of World War II. When Schultheis, a former Walt Disney Company engineer, disappeared in the jungles of Guatemala in 1955, it seemed any sort of public legacy was destined to vanish with him. However, after his widow's death, a treasure trove of his historically significant documents and photographs emerged.

Ongoing, Central Library

Treasures of Los Angeles Annenberg Gallery

The Annenberg Gallery displays some of the extraordinary materials collected by the Los Angeles Public Library since its founding in 1872. The inaugural exhibit, "Treasures of Los Angeles," features items from the Hollywood collection, including vintage film posters, publicity photographs ("stills"), postcards and other promotional items such as photo advertisements ("lobby cards") from Mexican films of the 1950s and 1960s. The Hollywood collection is from the Frances Howard Goldwyn — Hollywood Regional Branch Library and it is our featured collection.
