Chatsworth Library Book Club



The story of Clara Driscoll, head of Tiffany's women's division. Clara helped to design the famed Tiffany lamps, which brought acclaim and much needed cash to the company. She struggles to find a way to mass produce the lamps, as she also deals with personal burdens.

June 4, 2014 <u>The Girls of Atomic City: the untold</u> story of the women who helped win World War II by Denise Kiernan – Call # 976.82K47 – 2013 - 315 pages.



During the height of World War II, Oak Ridge, TN was one of the Manhattan Project's secret cities. It did not appear on any maps until 1949, even though it had a population of 75,000 and was using more electricity than New York City. Many of the people there were young

women recruited from small towns across the south. Their work was shrouded in mystery.

July 2, 2014 My Beloved World by Sonia Sotomayor – 2013 – Autobiography – Call # 347.092 S 781 – 315 pages.



The first Hispanic U. S. Supreme Court Justice recounts her life from a Bronx housing project to the federal bench.
