

JUDGING A BOOK BY IT'S COVER - Aka (50 cents well spent)

I admit it; I judged a book by its cover. I was at the Chatsworth Friends quarterly book sale and picked up "Stolen Away" by Max Allan Collins (1991) purely on the fact that Clive Cussler endorsed it as an interesting alternate time line read. Hmm, well I thought, I have enjoyed Clive Cussler books in the past and its style and depth of his storylines, so I paid the 50 cents to take the paperback home. The book was about the Lindbergh baby kidnapping from the perspective of a fictional Chicago police detective. I enjoyed the book thoroughly, but paused after reading the first few chapters, to brush up on the real events of the kidnapping and the people involved. When I resumed reading the book, I noticed that Collins had done his research as well, and used every single person involved with the case as part of his storyline, and how his fictional police detective interacted with said individuals throughout the case, and provided insight and perspective from his point of view, and a proposed ending that was different than the historical outcome. I felt the book was about 50 pages too long for me in the middle, but the latter part of the book really picked up and I liked the "alternative" ending to the case. I also learned something as well. Kidnapping became a federal offense as a result of the true case of the Lindbergh kidnapping. I did not know that, but found it through my additional readings on the subject.

I enjoyed the book enough to look into Max Allan Collins' other books and discovered that his fictional police detective Nathan Heller has also appeared in more than 20 other books. I believe I will look for "Flying Blind" at the library next, as that is about Amelia Earhart and her disappearance. After looking up the writer, he has written other storylines as follows (obtained from Wikipedia). Quarry series (US Marine sniper turned professional assassin), Nolan series (professional thief), Eliot Ness series, books featuring historical disasters, and many others as well as writing the Road to Perdition graphic novels, which was later made into a movie featuring Tom Hanks.

All in all, a great paperback found at the Friends of the Chatsworth Library book store, purchased for 50 cents. I wonder what other books that were written more than 20 years ago, that I have missed out on. Donna Boswell February, 2016




Library Book Club




