





The program begins with sign-ups June 4 but official start is June 11, running until August 4.




# Library Book Club



# Listen Up by Donna Boswell

This year's New Year's Resolution was to get through the Century Trilogy by Ken Follett. So happy to say I have finished book 1, The Fall of Giants. Book 1, unabridged is 24 CD's with 30.5 hours listening time, purchased for \$2 at the October 2017 book sale; such a deal! This is about 2 weeks of normal work commute. This is the first book that I have listened to, and not read of Ken Follett's. The reader was John Lee, and he did a great job with the various dialects which enabled me to keep track of characters.

The book follows 3 sets of siblings from various levels of society. They hail from Russia, Great Britain, and Wales. Folks from Germany and America are featured as well as lives are intertwined. This book follows events leading to World War I, the war itself and the aftermath. I have started book 2 already and I can tell it is weighing heavily on events leading to WWII, so it will be interesting to see what book 3 will entail.

What I enjoyed, besides the palatable history lesson, was the treatment of Follett's characters. Last year I read Sylvia Pankhurst's book about the Suffragette Movement; and Follett's characters reflect on the movement and their positions within it. Follett's method of dealing with historical people (Woodrow Wilson, Winston Churchill, etc) are to put them contextually in a position where it is plausible that they may have had an interaction with his fictional characters based on his research about time, locations, and speeches. So many parts of the book have elements of truth regarding battles and events that actually took place, and Follett uses known history to give a fictional first-hand account of events from the characters point of view.

I did start the second book, Winter of the World right away, it opens in Germany and features original characters from book 1 and their children as the children come of age. I am on the 3rd CD of 24 and it covers the Reichstag fire and the Nazi seizure of power. So stay tuned! Donna Boswell

Historian Mary Mallory dishes on memorable Hollywood hot spots and Singer Will Ryan performs famous period songs.






A young African-American visits his white girlfriend's parents for the weekend, where his simmering uneasiness about their reception of him eventually reaches a boiling point.
