CHATSWORTH HAS A BEAUTIFUL NEW LIBRARY AT LAST

I hope everyone has had a chance to visit the new Chatsworth Branch of the Los Angeles Public Library. The raves are unanimous, Chatsworth may have the most beautiful branch library in all of Los Angeles. Los Angeles Public Library has built thirty six new libraries in the last few years thanks to a 1999 bond issue passed by almost 70 percent of the voters in the city of Los Angeles. Each new building was ensured it's own individuality by having their own architect. While most new libraries are some sort of modern design, the Chatsworth Library design is a result of the library community construction meetings held in 2001 prior to construction. Community input was made that we wanted a design to reflect the western heritage theme that would honor Chatsworth's history. The architect came up with a plan for a building done in mission style reminiscent of the AK Smiley Public Library in Redlands. The result was that Chatsworth wound up with one of the gems of all the projects. Now that we have been open for going on three months we could put all the waiting behind us and enjoy the future of having this fantastic new building in the heart of Chatsworth.

Some of the features we now offer are 30 public access computers that offer internet as well as word processing, an excellent collection of DVD's, Videos, and CD's, a parking lot and building double the size of the old building. If you haven't come by please come and check us out. Please help our Friends help us rebuild our book collection.

DID YOU KNOW?

The new Chatsworth Library provides free access to computer workstations which are connected to the Library's information network. In addition to providing Internet access, these workstations enable the public to search LAPL's many electronic resources including the online catalog, over 100 subscription databases, word processing, language learning, literacy and a large historic document and photograph collection. Specially designed Web sites are provided for children, teens and Spanish speakers.
