





THANK YOU Chatsworth Library Staff, we know we have the best staff in the city!




Library Book Club


February 7, 2018 – <u>The Glass Castle: a memoir</u>


April 4, 2018 – <u>The Tea Girl of Humming Bird</u>

Fredrik Backman – Fiction – 2014 – 337 pages. Ove is a cranky curmudgeon, but behind the gruff exterior is a story and a sadness.



American Promise

American Promise is a documentary film spanning 13 years from directors Joe Brewster and Michèle Stephenson. The film captures the stories of Brewster and Stephenson's 5-year-old son Idris and his best friend and classmate Seun as these families navigate their way through the rigorous prep-school process. The film is set against the backdrop of a persistent educational achievement gap that dramatically affects African-American boys at all socioeconomic levels across the country.

American Promise premiered at the 2013 Sundance Film Festival. The filmmakers also launched a national campaign at Sundance to help raise \$100,000 and 100,000 volunteer hours for Big Brothers Big Sisters of America' Mentoring Brothers in Action program.




Ancient Peoples of the Channel Islands Monday, March 19, 2018 7pm

Please join us for a program on the Ancient Peoples of the Channel Islands. Beginning with the discovery of the oldest human remains ever found in North America – 13,000 year old Arlington Springs Man – to the true story of the Lone Woman of San Nicolas – the inspiration for the best selling children's book *Island of the Blue Dolphins*.

The evidence that people had arrived on Santa Rosa Island 13,000 years ago demonstrates that watercraft were in use along the California coast at that early date, and lends support to a theory that the earliest peoples to enter the Western Hemisphere may have migrated along



the Pacific coast from Siberia and Alaska using boats, along the "Kelp Highway".

Albert Knight and Ray Vincent will provide a brief introduction to the program, followed by excerpts from the public television program *West of the West, Tales from California's Channel Islands.*

The only way out is via sea, and the Germans have air superiority, bombing the British soldiers and ships without much opposition. The situation looks dire and, in desperation, Britain sends civilian boats to try to

evacuate the beleaguered forces. This is that story, seen through the eyes of a soldier amongst those trapped forces, two RAF fighter pilots and a group of civilians on their boat, part of the evacuation fleet.

Little by little, as the unwelcome guest arouses an uneasy sexual excitation among the women of the secluded boarding school, it is not before long that they will find themselves competing for the alluring man's favour. 
