

The Chatsworth Library Book Club meets the first Wednesday of every month from 1:00-2:30 PM in the Library Multipurpose Room. Our members choose the books they want to read, so we cover a large variety of subjects, both fiction and non-fiction. Our discussions are fun and insightful. The books can be ordered from the Library. Come join us! Our next books will be:

Jan. 6, 2016 – <u>Fall of Giants</u> by Ken Follet Fiction 2011 – 985 pages.

The book follows the fates of five interrelated families – American, German, Russian, English, and Welsh, as they move through the dramas of the First World War, the Russian Revolution and the struggle for woman's suffrage.

Feb. 3, 2016 - <u>The Invisible Woman: the story of Nelly Terman and Charles Dickens</u> by Claire

Tomalin - Call # 823 D548To – 1991 - 317 pages. Charles Dickens met Nelly Terman in 1857, when she was 18 and he was 45. They had an affair that lasted 13 years. It destroyed Dickens' marriage and effaced Nellie from the public record.

March 2, 2016 – *The Rosie Effect* by Graeme C.

Simsion - Fiction – 2014 - 344 pages Don and Rosie are happily married and living in New York. However their life is about to change when Rosie discovers she is pregnant and Don sets out to learn the protocols of becoming a father.

April 6, 2016 – <u>The Cockney Lad and Jim Crow</u> by John Sharer 2015 – 436 pages

In 1950, a seventeen- year-old Peter Mason sails from England to America. After spending a few days in New York, he drifts to Jackson, MS. What he finds there he will never forget, and it will irrevocably alter the course of his life.

May 4, 2016 - Wild: from Lost to Found on the Pacific Crest Trail by Cheryl Strayed - Call # 813 S913S - 2012 - 315 pages

Shattered at age 26 by the death of her mother and the end of her marriage, the author did something way out of the realm of her experience – she took a solo 1,100-mile hike along the Pacific Coast Trail.

June 1, 2016 – <u>One Thousand White Women: the</u> <u>journals of May Dodd</u> by Jim Fergus – Fiction-

1998 - 304 pages

The book tells of the "Brides for Indians" program launched in 1875 by the U. S. government under Ulysses S. Grant, to help assimilate Cheyenne Indians into the white man's world.


