



Chatsworth Library Book Club



February 5, 2014 <u>Benjamin Franklin: An</u> <u>American Life</u> by Walter Isaacson – Call # 92F831IS – 2003 – 590 pages.




A chronological narrative biography that focuses on Franklin as a "civic-minded man". He highlights the values and virtues of the rising middle class.

March 5, 2014 <u>The Namesake</u> by Jhumpa Lahiri – Fiction – 2003 – 291 pages.



The Namesake takes the Ganguli family from their tradition-bound life in Calcutta through their difficult transition into Americans in Cambridge, MA. It is a Pulitzer Prize winner. The book is this year's "L.A. City Big Read" selection.

April 2, 2014 And the Mountains Echoed by Khaled Hosseini – Fiction - 2013 - 404 pages.




The book is set in Afghanistan in 1952. It follows a family that loves and cares for one another and how that affects future generations. The family struggles through poverty together.

May 7, 2014 <u>Clara and Mr. Tiffany</u> by Susan Vreeland – Fiction – 2011 – 405 pages.



The story of Clara Driscoll, head of Tiffany's women's division. Clara helped to design the famed Tiffany lamps, which brought acclaim and much needed cash to the company. She struggles to find a way to mass produce the lamps, as she also deals with personal burdens.

June 4, 2014 <u>The Girls of Atomic City: the untold</u> story of the women who helped win World War II by Denise Kiernan – Call # 976.82K47 – 2013 - 315 pages.



During the height of World War II, Oak Ridge, TN was one of the Manhattan Project's secret cities. It did not appear on any maps until 1949, even though it had a population of 75,000 and was using more electricity than New York City. Many of the people there were young

women recruited from small towns across the south. Their work was shrouded in mystery.

July 2, 2014 My Beloved World by Sonia Sotomayor – 2013 – Autobiography – Call # 347.092 S 781 – 315 pages.



The first Hispanic U. S. Supreme Court Justice recounts her life from a Bronx housing project to the federal bench.
