


Our movie program is growing with movie selections by John and Zena Thorpe. If you have a movie suggestion, let us know.




Aug. 5, 2015 *The Rosie* **Project** by Graeme C. Simsion – Fiction – 2013 - 295 pages.

Don Tillman, a professor of genetics, sets up a project to find himself the perfect wife, starting with a questionnaire that has to be adjusted a little as he goes along. Then he meets Rosie, who

is everything he is not looking for in a wife. She becomes his friend as he helps her try to find her biological father.

Sept. 2, 2015 - <u>Pearl of China: a novel</u> by Anchee Min – Fiction - 2009 – 278 pages.



In a small town in southern China during the last days of the nineteenth century, two young girls, Willow and Pearl S. Buck embark on a friendship that will sustain them both through one of the most tumultuous periods in Chinese history.

Oct. 7, 2015 – *Still Alice* by Lisa Genova – Fiction – 2009 - 293 pages.



A celebrated linguist is diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's disease. As her inevitable decline begins, she struggles to live in the moment.


Nov. 4, 2015 – *The Kitchen House: A Novel* by Kathleen Grissom – Fiction – 2010 – 368 pages.



Orphaned while on ship from Ireland, seven-year-old Lavinia is sent to work in the kitchen house of a tobacco plantation where all other servants are black. Lavinia finds herself straddling two very different worlds. The story explores the meaning of family, where loyalty and love prevail.

Dec. 2, 2015 – <u>"Open Forum"</u> - Please come prepared to share information about a book you have read and think will be of interest to others.


Jan. 6, 2016 – *The Fall of Giants* by Ken Follett – Fiction 2011 – 985 pages.



The book follows the fates of five interrelated families – American, German, Russian, English, and Welsh, as they move through the dramas of the First World War, the Russian Revolution, and the struggle for woman's suffrage.




