Although the program requires a minimum of six months of twice per week, one-on-one tutoring to help individuals improve their English proficiency, Janet has tutored two students for a total of 10 years — logging an amazing 1,086 hours. We honor Janet for her outstanding dedication and advocacy of the literacy program.

July 5, 2017 – Open Forum – Please come prepared to share information about a book you have read and think will be of interest to others.



The book is based on the love story between Robert Louis Stevenson and American divorcee Fanny Van de Graft Osborne.





They use the number on the back of the card and the last four digits of their phone number to get access.

Visit your branch library with your Student Success Library Card and check out up to three books at one time. Don't worry if you can't get them back on time, we won't charge you when you check out books with your Student Success Card. As soon as you return your books, you can check out more.

If you want to check out more than three books or take home DVDs or CDs, a parent or guardian can sponsor you for a full-featured library card.
