The Chatsworth Book sales set-up crew is delighted with the new cabinets recently installed in the Community Room making storage and setup for the sales a breeze. The additional counter tops add more functionality to the room for use by all the organizations that use the facility, however the cabinets have a specific use and were actually designed to exact specifications for the boxes to maximize available storage. This has been the answer to Friends of the Library dreams...and the end of book storage nightmares. The convenience of having the books stored on site has made set-up and tear down so much more fun for all involved. Being able to set-up in record time, gives the crew the opportunity to enjoy the extra time to see what treasures are available to be sold once everything is displayed on Friday afternoon.

The cabinet project was coordinated and approved through the Library Commission and staff for the Los Angeles Public Libraries. The unique challenge presented was that the additional cabinets in the room had to match the existing décor and finishes for the new library and basically appear as though they were installed when the library was constructed.

The Chatsworth Neighborhood Council contributed \$1,500 of the \$5,700 tab for community room enhancement. Their show of support for our improvements and continued commitment to help improve our community makes a difference and we thank them for their involvement.

GAME DAY

We have a new program for young adults every Tuesday after school from 1:30 PM to 4:30 PM. Tuesdays are the day where all the Lawrence Middle School students are let out of school at 1:30 PM with no place to go except the library, Mc Donalds or Taco Bell since they are not picked up by their parent or guardian until much later in the afternoon or early evening.

We thank our Friends for purchasing games such as Chess, Checkers, Monopoly, Clue, Life, UNO, Connect Four, etc. We open the Meeting Room with Library Staff supervision for what we are calling GAME DAY. So far in our first six Tuesday afternoons we have a core group of 15-30 latchkey kids who have enjoyed the program.

I challenge Mason Park and Chatsworth Park as well as LAUSD to provide additional after-school activities for the young teens in our community. I also encourage the community to persuade LAPD to make a greater presence during these after school hours.

We meet every first Wednesday of the Month from 1-2:30 PM in the Library Meeting Room. Our schedule of reading is as follows:

April 4th "Mountains Beyond Mountains" by Tracy Kidder is a non-fiction about a doctor who came from a poor background and grew up to be famous and make great advances in medicine.

May 2nd "The Shell Seekers" by Rosamunde Pilcher is the story of a widow recovering from a heart attack and her musings about her life and family.

There will be a 3-month summer hiatus in June, July and August. The next meeting will be in September:

September 5th "Middlemarch" by George Eliot is the story of an English Provincial town in the 1830's and the intricate web of technological progress, circumstances and coincidences, that shape the lives of Middlemarch's inhabitants.

October 3rd "The Right Attitude to Rain" by Alexander McCall Smith is the story of life in Edinburgh, Scotland, today as seen through the eyes of a philosophical magazine editor.

November 7th "Anna Karenina" by Leo Tolstoy is set against the backdrop of czarist Russia and reveals the spectrum of nineteenth-century Russian politics and its many layers of social class from peasantry to aristocracy to the nobility.

Please contact the librarian to order books. Ordering takes 2 days to a week and the books are held for pick-up for 10 days.
